Over 62 staff members have multiple certifications relevant to their work and 47 have reached advanced levels in their training.

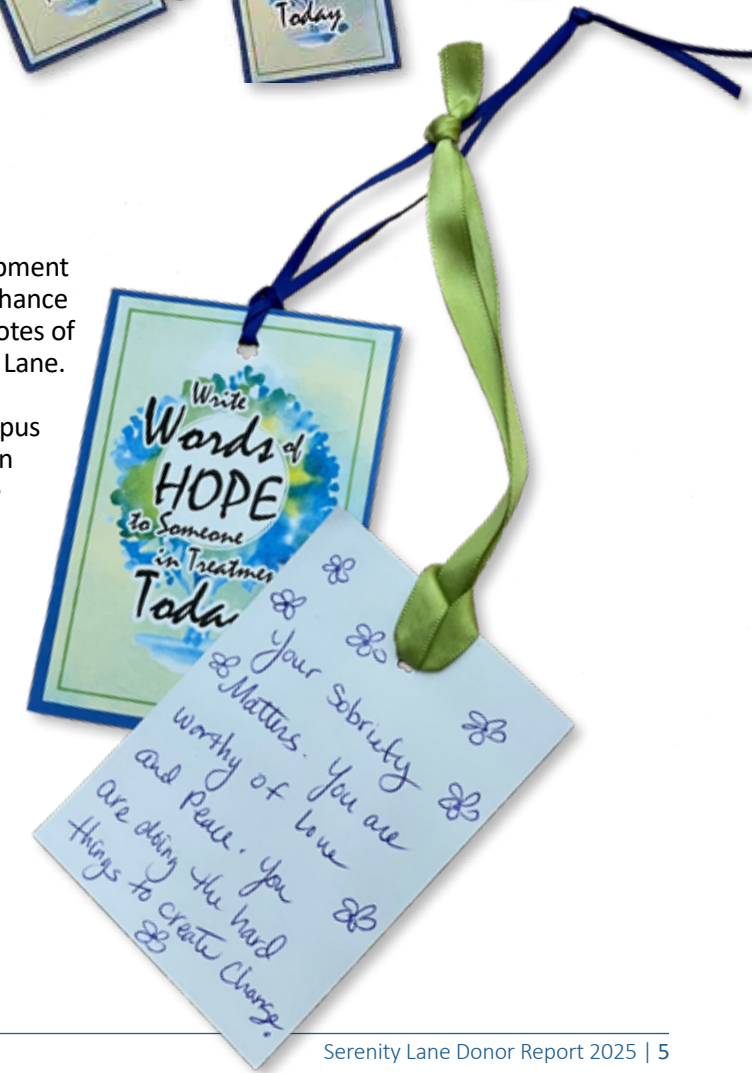


Messages of Hope

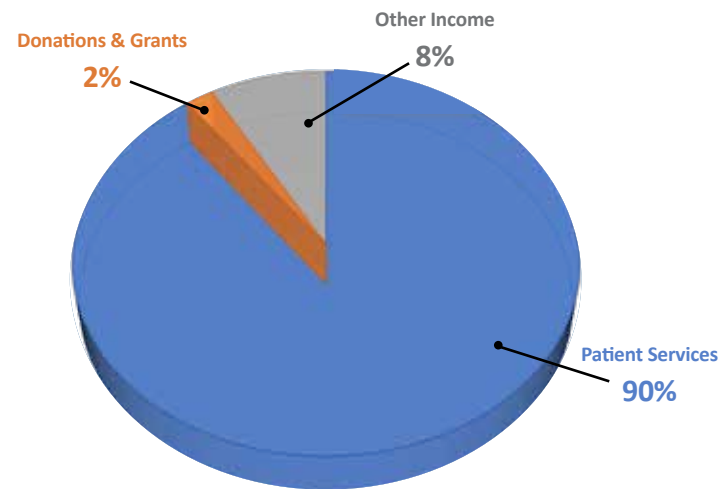

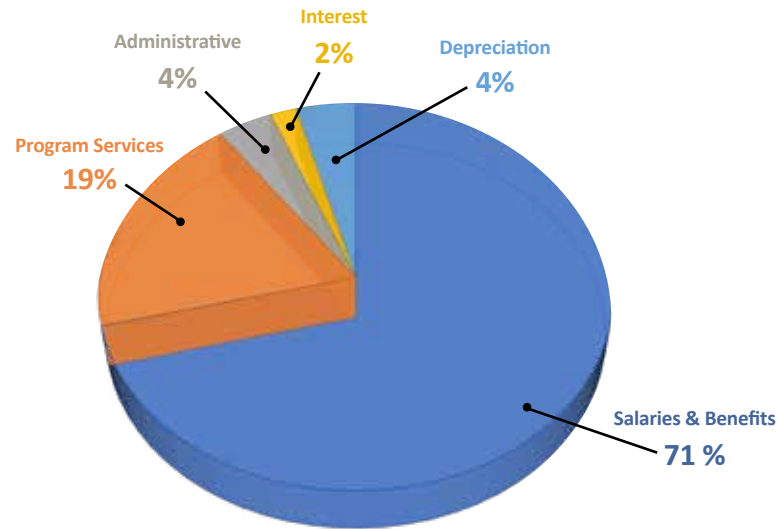

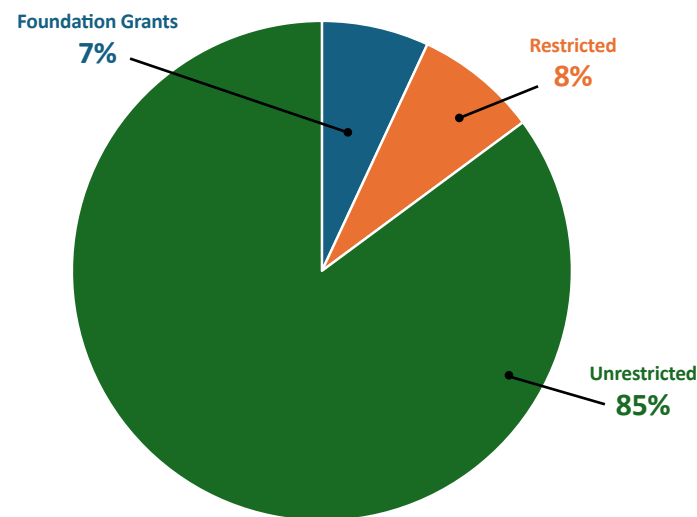

The Lasting Impact of Treatment



A family's story of experience, strength and hope.

"Gregg's drinking has really picked up lately and he's less and less present to us as a family. If I suggest a picnic or some other outing he is not interested because it won't involve alcohol."

Addiction is a disease that touches every member of the family. For real healing to take place, the whole family must address their role and find their own path to recovery so together, they can break the cycle.

"When we started treatment, I resented the hardship of driving an hour up and back to Eugene 5 nights a week-but every time we're in the car together, we are sharing what we learned that night and talking about lots of heavy stuff. It's been really good and we are closer than we have been for a long time. I'm actually optimistic."

In 1983, Gregg O. started treatment with Serenity Lane and has been sober ever since. With the help of Serenity Lane's Family Program, he and his wife

weathered the storm of his Alcohol Use Disorder and went on to create a legacy of love, commitment and support in their family.

"All 6 of us kids are very aware that there wouldn't be a 50th anniversary party if it wasn't for my dad's sobriety. In fact, three of my sisters wouldn't even be on the planet without my dad's sobriety. We are truly grateful for Serenity Lane and the role it has played in all of our lives - all 40 of us!"

At Serenity Lane's Annual Fundraising Dinner in May, Gregg and Corinne's full story was shared in a moving spoken word presentation that culminated with many of their children and grandchildren joining them on stage. We are grateful for the family's ongoing support of Serenity Lane and for so vulnerably sharing their powerful story of hope, legacy and love.

At the 2025 Annual Fundraising Dinner, a generous community of supporters joined together to raise critical funds for programs that insurance doesn't cover—but are essential to healing and recovery. Funds directly support life-changing services like our Family Program, which helps loved ones heal alongside those in treatment.

The Power of Community in Sustaining Recovery

September is National Recovery Month, a reminder that healing doesn't happen in isolation – it flourishes in connection. A 2024 study published in *The Journal of Behavioral Health Services & Research* looked at peer-based recovery programs across dozens of sites and found something powerful: people who stayed engaged with peer support and alumni-style communities had better long-term outcomes. These included reduced substance use, improved health, stronger relationships with providers, and better access to essential resources like housing and employment.

The takeaway is clear – community is not just a feel-good addition to recovery – it's a protective factor that helps people stay grounded, connected, and supported as they rebuild their lives. Shared experiences remind us we're not alone, while encouragement from peers can spark new motivation to stay on track. By showing up for each other, sharing stories, and celebrating milestones, peers help transform recovery from an individual struggle into a collective strength that can last a lifetime.



In November 2024, we launched Serenity for Life, a program designed for those who have completed and/or engaged in any level of treatment or programming at Serenity Lane. Through events, a robust online community, and resources to help alumni track their ongoing progress, we are here to help them continue to move towards their best lives, and grow in their recovery.

Because we know that the first year in recovery is the most crucial, our growing Alumni Services Team reaches out regularly to alumni to see how they are doing and provide support if needed. We are committed to those we serve, not just today, but for life.
